Good Afternoon Commissioners,

As the seawall remains closed due to structural integrity issues we would like to offer that if you are interested in a guided tour we are happy to arrange one with you, along with the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). This area is considered a dangerous work zone. Our communications team is working alongside our operations folks to properly message out the danger of being on particular spots of the seawall at this time.

Staff are finding it challenging to keep folks from walking the seawall even while the risk associated remains high in many areas. Walkers/runners/cyclists may not see the risk, and the team is doing an amazing job removing debris and securing the pathway, however, the foundation of the seawall has been severely compromised.

Thank you for your patience as we continue to assess the damage and remediate the issues as quickly as we are able.
