#### Design: "The City Spoke"



We are a friendly cheerful people but we sometimes need cheering up ourselves, and what better way than to be greeted by the city itself. The bright yellow color gives a much needed happy tone which would be cherished during our more rainy

cameraderie and sense of joy that proliferates the city in the summer months. These racks would also serve as a fun prop for tourists or locals taking and sharing photos of the city. One could take a picture with the rack itself and the greeting given by the city could be extended around the world. The name of the piece is a reference to both the spoke of a bicycle and the voice of the city, which is happy and welcoming of everyone.

This fucntional design could potentially hold up to 4 bicycles


between the letterforms, and 2 when placed in narrower areas parallel to sidewalks. As Far as height and opening restrictions go, the letter sizes could be adjusted until they suited both considerations. This design would serve as a functional scuplture piece more or less, and should be installed in places where it would have maximum legibility for the highest number of people (against walls, facing into the sidewalk it is placed on). My reccomendation would be to use the typeface Helvetica Rounded as it is a branch of the most universally loved typeface and the rounded style makes the rack even more friendly and approachable.


### THE CITY SPOKE


### NORTH SHORE MOUNTAINS


### **ALWAYS GREEN VANCOUVER V01**


#### THE PEAK BIKE RACK

The Peak Bike Rack is inspired by the cultural associations we have of the North Shore mountains and their visible significance as a means of orientation within the urban landscape.




### THE GUARD BIRD

Instead of a guard dog, here is the guard bird, a friendly helper always ready to hold a Vancouver cyclist's bike (or two).




# **CITY GRID**


# CHICKADEE-DEE-DEE


### SALMON - VITAL JOURNEY


### ORCAWAVEMOUNTAIN


# TREE RACK


#### PETAL RACK


### **DEFINITELY RAINING**

Shaped like a raindrop, sized to a bike wheel.




# FED UP BIRD


#### **BIKE BUDDY**


#### **URBAN PEAKS**


# THE PEOPLE BIKE RACK


# LIVING LEAF


### LEAF

I find Vancouver a very modern city and a leaf is a popular symbol for modern living. It is also very decorative and adds character to Vancouver.




### POSER


#### SALMON RUN


#### PINNED

Vancouver is a destination. Drop these pins around the city to inform cyclists new to Vancouver which neighborhood are currently in, or what landmark is nearby.




#### **TREE SERIES - 18**


### THE MOUNTAINS

Vancouver would just be another city without "The Mountains".




### **BLACK BEAR**

My design is a tribute to the humble Black Back, an animal synonymous with Vancouver. The bear will stand guard over the bikes, and provide sculptural beauty to any street.




# GATEWAY TO ADVENTURE


### DRIPDROP


### SKY-SEA RACK
