GRANT INFORMATION

Purpose, Intent and Eligibility

The purpose and intent of the <u>Community Housing Incentive Program</u> (CHIP) grant is to assist non-profit and co-op housing providers in constructing affordable housing on their own land in Vancouver. This program complements the patchwork of senior government funding programs to meet the City's range of affordability objectives across unit types and rent mix. Through CHIP's Stream 1, the City will support non-market housing projects that are self-sustaining, leveraging capital funding and low-cost senior government financing. Through CHIP's Stream 2, the City will support non-market housing projects targeting a deep level of affordability that rely on ongoing operating subsidies from senior governments (e.g. BC Housing's CHF and IHF). This application is for CHIP Stream 1 only. For more detailed information, and support in completing the application, please consult the CHIP Guidelines for Stream 1.

Voting members of the Board of Directors of a Society receiving funds from the City of Vancouver may not be remunerated for services to the society, but they may be reimbursed for expenses.
