Q1: Which stream(s) of cultural core funding is my organization eligible for?

Q2: If we are eligible for more than one stream of core funding, which one should we select?

Q3: Can we indicate interest in more than one program?

No. You may only select one program in the form (and you may submit only one EOI form), but staff will contact you if your organization is a better fit for another program.

Q4: Do we need to fill out the EOI if we are already receiving COFA, CEG, or CIG?

No, you do not. You should only submit an EOI if you are not currently receiving core support, <u>or</u> if you are currently receiving CEG or CIG and wish to express interest in applying for COF.

Q5: When will we hear if we will be invited to apply to a core support program?

Applicants will be contacted in August

Q6: What if my organization does not get invited to apply to a core funding stream, after submitting an EOI?

Your organization can continue to apply to the CASC program (next intake in September for projects taking place January-June 2026). If your organization is invited to apply to a core funding stream, we recommend you still apply for CASC in September, since funding is not guaranteed.

Q7: Will this EOI be an annual intake or just a one-time intake?

To be determined based on available funds.

Q8: How is the EOI reviewed?

Staff will review the EOIs for eligibility and consider the demonstrated track record of organizations in meeting program priorities according to peer assessments and previous CASC projects.

Q9: What is the assessment process for COF, CIF, and CEAF program applications?

COF applications will be reviewed by a peer assessment committee comprised of two community assessors and one staff member, as outlined in the COF Info Guide. CEAF and CIF applications will also be reviewed by a peer assessment committee comprised of community and staff members.

Q10: What is an Expression of Interest? What is the purpose?

An Expression of Interest (EOI) is a formal way of showing interest in a particular opportunity, in this case, cultural operating funding streams. The Grants & Awards team is

using this process to identify potential applicants prior to a more detailed selection process.

As funding is limited, and core funding applications require a lot of labour, the EOI process is intended to reduce time and resources by focusing on eligible applicants that fulfill the funding program criteria.

The EOI process also enables us to implement an open process to identify applicants and gives a clear indication of program demand in order to plan and allocate future resources.
