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**1. 601 W. Cordova St. - DP-2025-00916
Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Station,
Heritage Impact Assessment & Conservation Strategy
VHR-listed, M**

Staff and the applicant team provided a presentation and responded to questions and comments. Following discussion, it was

WHEREAS:

1. The City of Vancouver has received a Development Permit Application from Cadillac Fairview Corporation for alterations to the below-grade structure of the 3-storey Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Station (municipally designated as a Protected Heritage Building) and to develop the site addressed 601 W Cordova Street (formerly 555 W Cordova Street) adjacent to the Heritage Building with a 22-storey office building; and
2. Also adjacent, to the east of the site, is the provincially designated 7-storey Heritage Building known as the Kelly, Douglas & Co. Warehouse, (municipally designated as a

Protected Heritage Building) and the western edge of the Gastown Historic Area municipally designated and nationally recognized as a historic urban district); and

3. The Application received by the City of Vancouver also includes a Heritage Impact Assessment addressing the CPR Station, impact on the Kelly, Douglas & Co, Warehouse building, the proximity to Gastown Historic Area, and a Conservation Strategy specific to the CPR Station, prepared by Luxton, dated December 2025.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

- A. THAT the Vancouver Heritage Commission does not support the proposed 22-storey office tower adjacent to several important Heritage Buildings that are character-defining features of the central waterfront on the site at 601 West Cordova Street, because the Commission does not find the proposal to be compatible with and subordinate to the existing heritage building nor historic area of Gastown;
- B. THAT the Vancouver Heritage Commission does not endorse the Heritage Impact Assessment presented addressing the CPR Station, the Gastown Historic District, and the Kelly, Douglas & Co, Warehouse building, but does endorse in principle the Conservation Strategy specific to the CPR Station prepared by Luxton, dated December 2025.

**2. 2733 Heather St. - RZ-2024-00043
Vancouver General Hospital (VGH) Campus Master Plan & Heather Pavilion
VHR-listed, M, HRA**

WHEREAS:

1. The City of Vancouver has received a Rezoning Application from Vancouver Coastal Health for the Vancouver General Hospital campus which contemplates the demolition of the Heather Pavilion, 2733 Heather Street; and
2. A portion of the Heather Pavilion, including the 1906 original Pavilion and the 1908 additions, is designated as a municipally protected heritage property with a Heritage Revitalization Agreement registered on title; and
3. The application is accompanied by a Conservation Management Plan, which includes a Statement of Significance for the designated parts of the Pavilion and with commemorative intent to memorialize the Heather Pavilion, dated November 14, 2025, prepared by ERA Consultants.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

- A. THAT The Vancouver Heritage Commission supports in principle the proposed master plan for the future redevelopment of the Vancouver General Hospital campus, subject to further work being done by the applicant, working with staff on developing conservation approaches for the Heather Pavillion for retention and adaptive reuse, including relocation of the building or its components;
- B. Further that it is recommended that the applicant continues to consult with the Indigenous Coast Salish Nations.
