RE: Upcoming work on Water Street/Powell Street to shift to a winter layout

With the support of the Gastown Business Improvement Society (GBIS), staff will extend components of the summer pilot to learn how they perform through the winter months. Starting September 15th, crews will begin work on Water Street and Powell Street that will reconfigure the street into a winter layout. The work performed by crews will include relocating barriers and planters, adding on-street parking and loading, and adjusting the road paint.

What to expect


Weather dependent, Water Street will be closed for approximately two days the week of September 15 and one day the week of September 22. Residents, businesses and visitors to the area can expect the following during the Water Street closures:

- Drivers can expect full closures in Maple Tree Square and along Water Street from Carrall Street to Richards Street.
- Local access to laneways for residents and businesses on the north side of Water Street will be allowed at Abbott Street and Cambie Street.
- In addition to the closures on Water Street, Powell Street from Columbia Street to Carrall Street will be closed for approximately 6 hours on September 15.
- Traffic control will be on site to facilitate all road closures and will assist with local access, where possible.
