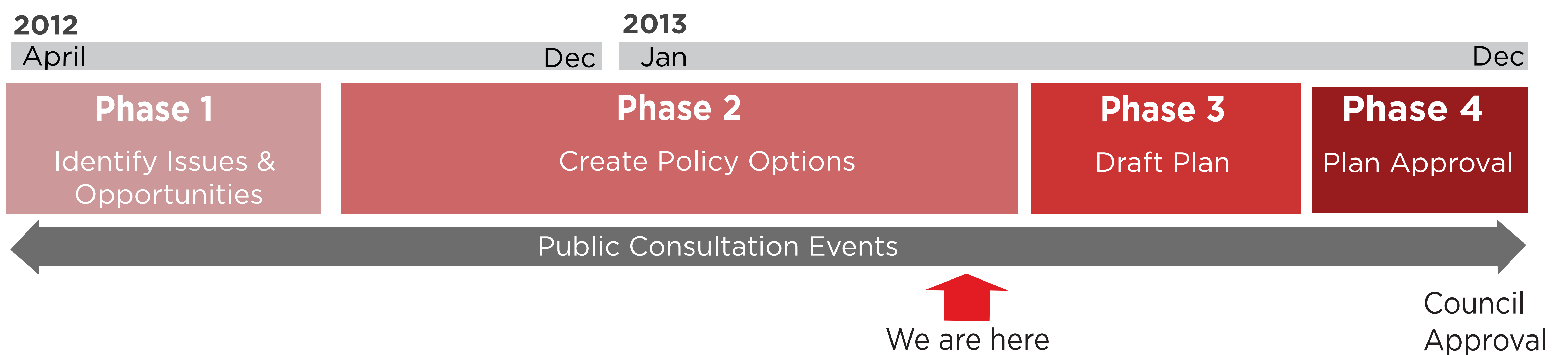


In the spring of 2012, the City of Vancouver embarked on a comprehensive community planning program in the Grandview-Woodland neighbourhood. The process involved extensive public and stakeholder consultation. When completed, the plan will replace a Local Area Plan that was developed between 1979 and 1983.

Work on the new Grandview-Woodland Plan has and will unfold in **four key stages**, each of which with a number of opportunities for community participation and public involvement.



Phase 1 was launched in Spring 2012, and began the planning process by:

- Compiling relevant city-wide policies
- Reviewing the existing research on neighbourhood issues,
- Discussing the needs, challenges, and opportunities related to the plan's key areas of focus with the community, and;
- Developing a local area profile

In total, over **2,000** people participated in the community engagement process during Phase 1. These early discussions allowed a broad framework to be formed to help shape the next phase of more focused conversations.

Phase 2 began in Fall 2012 and aims to further advance the planning process and policy generation by:

- Developing community-wide policy options,
- Creating sub-area plans, and;
- Creating community action projects and plans

Over **2,600** people took part of the neighbourhood engagement events during Phase 2, so far...
