## What's happening?

MacLean Park is a 1.21-hectare community park in the Strathcona neighbourhood bounded by Keefer Street, East Georgia Street, Heatley Avenue and Hawks Avenue. The park includes a baseball diamond, grass sports field, playground, public washroom and spray park.

We're renewing the spray park and fieldhouse washrooms at MacLean Park. This work involves replacing these aging features, improving accessibility, and supporting a safe, inclusive neighbourhood space.

The upgrades include:

- Spray park renewal: new water spray features, surfacing, and mechanical system upgrades to replace the aging spray park.
- Washroom renewal: universal washrooms will accommodate greater accessibility and comfort to meet the needs of all community members.

The design will include references to local character including historic Strathcona architecture.



Vision and objectives



### Vision

When developing the design for this renewal the vision was to provide an inclusive and refreshed recirculating spray park that meets the needs of the community.

## **Project objectives**

The project objectives below demonstrate how the spray park renewal will connect with the Park Board's VanPlay and VanSplash master planning documents.

- Expanding the quality and diversity of features for users of all ages (VanPlay and Playground Strategy).
- New spray park features provide additional community cooling during extreme weather events (VanPlay).
- Place accessible spray parks near washroom facility to improve community access (VanSplash).
- Additional seating opportunities in the sun and shade create more connections to the overall park.
- Providing areas of varying water intensities to splish, splash and sploosh allows for more choice when using the spray park.

Draft spray park concept plan




East Georgia Street

The draft concept design is inspired by the wind and clouds as they move through the pitched roofs that are common in Strathcona. These shapes will be reflected on the ground through colourful patterns as well as in some of the features.

The proposed mix of above ground and in-ground spray features would allow for a range of interactions with the site.

- Misting Sprays
- Existing seat wall
- 2 Ground sprays
- Drinking fountain
- Overhead feature
- New universal washrooms in Fieldhouse
- Interactive play
- Proposed seating
- 5 Custom spray features





Proposed spray park features

The spray park features are grouped into five key categories. Final features to be selected during detailed design.









Misting features mist water to allow for community cooling.
These features are often for users just looking to cool off as opposed to playing in the spray park.







Ground sprays encourage interaction with water on the surface of the spray park. They can send water in a variety of directions and intensities.








Overhead features typically drip, spill, or spray water on users. Some features allow for the directing and turning of features for further interaction.








Interactive play allows users to adjust the flow of water from a nozzle or spigot. The tables direct the water in different ways depending on user interaction with wheels, weirs, and flaps.







Custom spray features are elements created to connect the spray park with the community. They often resemble a theme, style, or character connected to the park's context.






