PHASE 1: **PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT**

From Oct 17th to Nov 15th 2020. the Vancouver Park Board hosted the first phase of engagement to connect with the public on shaping the future of the new urban park at Main & 7th.

We interacted with over 2,400 people through an online survey and ideas map on the City of Vancouver's 'Shape Your City' engagement platform. Participants provided ideas, opportunities and values that will help guide the park's design and delivery.


Residents were notified of the public consultation through mailout postcards, social media and posters displayed around the Mount Pleasant neighbourhood.


Feedback received from the Phase 1 engagement is summarized in this report.



The Main & 7th Park will include a number of different and dynamic elements that will make a unique urban park within the heart of Vancouver.


To better understand hat kind of park the public desired, we asked the following questions that would help guide the preliminary park design.

36% of those surveyed want the space to be Lively and Social, with the Natural and **Restorative** coming in a close second.


Similarly, many want the park to be a **gathering space** for friends and family to meet in Mount Pleasant.


There was lots of support for a multi-use space, screened from the traffic noise of Main Street's hustle and bustle.


MORE PARK IDEAS!

Design a park unique to Mount Pleasant that promotes a lively space for all and strengthens the neighbourhood's vibrant culture and community.



A PLACE TO MEET FRIENDS & FAMILY

Create a safe and inviting meeting place for people to socialise with friends and family.



A LUSH PARK WITH TREES FOR SHADE

Grow a lush pocket of nature in Mount Pleasant to provide a little respite.



A MULTI-USE FLEXIBLE SPACE

Create a dynamic and multi-functional park that can host a diversity of community events throughout the seasons.
