- SUBJECT: Economic Impact of COVID-19 Bi-Monthly Labour Force Data: April 2021

Highlights: Monthly Labour Force Survey Data, April 2021

- Employment in Vancouver increased from 1,459,200 in February to 1,468,700 in April for a gain of 9,500 (0.7%) jobs
- The unemployment rate decreased by 1.1 percentage points to 6.8% in Vancouver between February and April
- Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased by 0.1 percentage points, to 8.1%.
- Cumulatively, employment in the region has decreased by -19,700 (-1.3%) since February 2020

Purpose of this memo

This memo highlights Labour Force Survey (LFS) data published by Statistics Canada for the reference weeks from March and April 2021. The LFS provides estimates for the unemployment rate and employment totals by industry and occupation on a monthly basis. The information presented in these memos illustrates the impact of COVID-19 on Vancouver's labour force and economy over the most recent 2-month period since the Pandemic began. Staff in Planning, Urban Design and Sustainability (PDS) will provide updated memos approximately aligned to the milestones set by the Province of British Columbia's Restart Plan released on May 25th, 2021. This information is meant to be viewed in conjunction with other socio-economic and community statistics to form a cohesive picture of the City's current state and assist with recovery and resilience planning. This information will be posted to the City website and shared with the business community.



Important notes about the data

The statistics presented in this memo are for the Metro Vancouver region as the Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) is the smallest geography level available for LFS data tables published by Statistics Canada. Throughout this memo, the term "Vancouver" refers to the Vancouver CMA. The LFS data used to create the statistics presented in this report are not seasonally adjusted¹.

Changes in employment totals and unemployment rate

Employment in Vancouver increased from 1,459,200 in February to 1,468,700 in April for a gain of 9,500 (0.7%) jobs. Since February, the unemployment rate decreased by 1.1 percentage points to 6.8% in Vancouver. In April 2021, the region had -19,700 (-1.3%) less employed workers than in February 2020. Despite this slight decrease, it is a significant improvement in employment, which peaked in April 2020 where a total loss of 251,200 (-17.2%) employed workers was recorded since February 2020. Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased by 0.1 percentage points between February and April to 8.1%.

The fluctuations in employment levels from March 2020 to April 2021 reflects changes to public health restrictions and other measures, including increased limitations on some businesses under "circuit breaker" restrictions in late March. A number of major orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic issued by various levels of government were active during the reference weeks (March 14th to March 20th and April 11th to April 17th, 2021). Please see Figure 7 for a full list of announcements and orders made since the previous reference period. Appendix A shows all prior announcements and orders starting on March 12, 2020. The next labour force survey memo will be distributed in July, which will include new data for May and June.




Figure 1 – Unemployment rate and monthly employment change in Metro Vancouver




Changes in employment totals and unemployment rate – three-month moving average

The following sections highlight statistics related to employment change by industry and occupation that are published as a three-month moving average for Vancouver; therefore, data published for April is an average of February, March and April. Using this three-month moving average data, employment in April was 1,473,400 and the unemployment rate was 7.4%. The

following chart shows the monthly change of employment and the unemployment rate using three-month moving average employment data.

Industry overview

Employment in the health care and social assistance industry experienced the largest twomonth gain in Metro Vancouver, increasing by 14,800 workers (8.4%). The second largest sector employment increase was in the wholesale and retail trade sector, which gained 9,900 workers (4.7%). The third most employment gains was in business, building and other support services, which increased by 5,700 jobs (9.1%). Between February and April, the largest employment decline was in the accommodation and food services sector, which declined by 14,600 people, a decrease of -14.2% of its workforce. The second most losses were seen in information, culture and recreation, which declined by an additional 3,400 workers (-3.9%) between February and April. Construction declined by 2,600 workers (-2.5%) over the two month period.





Figure 3 – Employment change by industry in Metro Vancouver, February to April

Occupation overview

Occupation employment data for Vancouver is published as a three-month moving average; therefore, data published for April is an average of February, March and April. Employment in business, finance and administration occupations experienced the largest 2-month gain in Metro Vancouver, increasing by 14,800 jobs (6.2%) between February and April. The second largest increase was in health occupations, which gained 10,200 workers (9.8%). The third largest employment gain was in sales and service occupations, which increased by 6,400 jobs (1.9%). Between February and April, employment in natural and applied sciences and related occupations experienced the largest decrease with 7,500 less workers (-4.1%). The second largest loss was attributed to occupations in manufacturing and utilities, which experienced a decrease of 6,500 jobs (-17.4%). Trades, transport and equipment operators declined the third most, with a loss of 2,400 (-1.3%).


Figure 4 – Employment change by occupations in Metro Vancouver, February to April

The largest increase in employment by detailed occupations was for administrative and financial supervisors and administrative occupations, which increased by 10,700 (+16.1%) workers between February and April. Other occupations with the most employment gains from February and April include:

- Office support occupations (+8,900; +20.5%)
- Technical occupations in art, culture, recreation and sport (+8,000; +23.3%)
- Middle management occupations in trades, transportation, production and utilities (+7,400; +21.1%)
- Sales support occupations (+6,900; +20.3%)

The largest decrease in employment by detailed occupations was for technical occupations related to natural and applied sciences, which lost 10,200 (-17.4%) workers since the previous month. Other occupations with significant employment losses include:

- Specialized middle management occupations (-8,800; -18.4%)
- Professional occupations in business and finance (-7,300; -8.9%)
- Technical occupations in health (-7,300; -28.5%)
- Transport and heavy equipment operation and related maintenance occupations (-6,800; -11.8%)




Figure 6 – Most employment loses by detailed occupation, February to April

Government orders

A number of major orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic have been issued by various levels of government since March 2020. Figure 7 lists new orders and announcements that have been issued over a two-month period from February 21st to April 17th. A full list of orders and announcements since March 2020 is reported in Appendix A. The next Economic Impact of COVID-19 - Monthly Labour Force Data memo will be released in July and will highlight changes in employment from April to June.

Upcoming LFS data and memo releases

Statistics Canada is scheduled to release LFS data on a monthly basis. The following table illustrates the upcoming LFS data releases and their estimated reference periods. As the B.C. government has released a Restart Plan for the province on May 25th, 2021, Staff in PDS will change the frequency of memo releases to approximately align with the major milestones denoted in this plan. The column on the right of Figure 8 indicates when a new Economic Impact of COVID-19 – Labour Force Data Memo will be issued in conjunction with the LFS data release. Each memo will cover data from the LFS releases since the previous memo was issued. After the memo covering LFS data to December 2021 has been released, PDS Staff will reassess the need to continue further memos with consideration for whether the urgency from the Pandemic has concluded.
