SUBJECT: Clean Energy Incentive – 500 Homer Street Film Kiosks

We're pleased to share some exciting news for Vancouver's film community!

The City of Vancouver has installed two new 200 Amp, 3-phase clean energy kiosks in the 500 block of Homer Street, now available to support film productions in and around the downtown core.

These new installations enhance our growing network of clean power options and complement existing grid tie-ins at:

- Vancouver Art Gallery
- Northeast False Creek
- The Crescent in the Shaughnessy Neighbourhood

These additional kiosks expand opportunities for productions to reduce their environmental footprint—and help meet the requirements for the Clean Energy Incentive. Productions that use at least 50% clean energy sources on location are eligible for a reduction in permit fees.

Clean energy sources can include any combination of:

- Battery systems
- Private property building tie-ins
- City of Vancouver film power kiosks

To support the transition to cleaner filming practices, production is expected to use a clean energy kiosk whenever one is available at or near their filming or parking location. These installations mark another meaningful step in strengthening Vancouver's leadership in sustainable film-making, and we look forward to production embracing these resources and the advantages they provide.
