# Advance registration for the Vancouver by-election closes February 11

## Are you registered to vote?

The Vancouver Election Office is preparing the voters list for the 2025 Vancouver by-election to be held on April 5, 2025. The voters list includes all registered Vancouver voters, their names, and residential addresses. Elections BC provides the list to the Vancouver Election Office. Everyone registered to vote in the last provincial election is automatically on Vancouver's voters list and will not need to register again.

Eligible voters may also register when they vote, either in person or by mail.

Advance registration for City of Vancouver non-resident property electors (NRPE) will close on February 11, 2025.

To register or to update your information, go to vancouver.ca/vote.

## Eligible voters in Vancouver must:

- Be 18 years old or older on Election Day (April 5, 2025)
- Be a Canadian citizen
- Have lived in B.C. for at least six months immediately before the day you register
- Live in Vancouver (no minimum days required) OR own property registered in your name in Vancouver for at least 30 days immediately before registering to vote. To register as a non-resident property elector (NRPE) go to vancouver.ca/vote for information about the required documents; and
- Not be disqualified by law from voting

Residents of UBC Lands and the University Endowment Lands are not eligible to vote in this by-election as no Vancouver School Board Trustees will be on the ballot. Residents of these areas are only eligible to vote for Vancouver School Board Trustees.

### Voters List Available for Inspection

A copy of the voters list will be available for public inspection between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday (excluding statutory holidays), at the City Clerk's Office, Vancouver City Hall (453 West 12th Avenue), and at the Election Office (305 West 8th Avenue) starting February 18, 2025.

### Remove or hide your personal information in the voters list

You may request that the City remove or hide your address on the voters list to protect your privacy or security. Find out more at vancouver.ca/vote.

#### Objecting to the Registration of a Voter

A qualified voter can object to another voter listed on the voters list by submitting a signed objection in writing to the Chief Election Officer at <u>election@vancouver.ca</u>. The deadline for registering an objection is 4:00 p.m. on February 28, 2025.
