RE: Update on Pine St and W 1st Ave Link – Connecting Arbutus and Seaside Greenway

Dear Business/Resident,

Earlier in May, we reached out to the community for feedback on our Pine St & W 1st Ave Link proposal. The link aims to create a connection for people cycling between the Arbutus Greenway and the Seaside Greenway that is safe and comfortable for people of all ages and abilities (AAA) while accommodating access and loading for nearby businesses and residents. Thank you to those who reached out by email or attended one of our information and discussion sessions.

Over the past two months, we heard from stakeholders along the route, with feedback ranging from support to firmer stances in opposition. We plan to take some time over the coming months to **further review the feedback and explore design alternatives on Pine St and W 1st Ave**. To give this work the space it needs, we will **not move forward with implementation this summer**.

Pine St and W 1st Ave remain the preferred route linking the two greenways, as unanimously approved by City Council in 2018 through the Arbutus Greenway: Design Vision and Implementation Strategy. There are a number of reasons why this route is preferred:

1. It's a direct route between the Arbutus Greenway and the Seaside Greenway (Seawall).
2. It has fewer underground parking, laneway, and driveway accesses to accommodate.
3. The existing bike-activated crossing at Pine St and W 4th Ave intersection can be retained.
4. There are more opportunities to retain parking spaces than on alternative routes.
