Dear Business owner:

RE: Kingsway-Main Street Bus Priority

We are writing to inform you of planned changes to curbside parking and bus lanes along Kingsway and Main St, and to seek your input on potential impacts to business deliveries and loading.

In early 2026, the City of Vancouver and TransLink are planning to **extend bus lanes, relocate some bus stops, and improve major intersections** to help buses move smoothly through traffic and stay on time. These improvements are intended to:

- Shorten travel time for thousands of transit riders on routes 19, 3, 8, 25, and 26
- Enhance transit access to destinations in Mount Pleasant, Kensington-Cedar Cottage, Joyce-Collingwood, and across the city
- Improve traffic and flow at major intersections
- Balance and mitigate impacts to parking and loading for businesses, where possible

This project will advance <u>Council direction</u> to prioritize transit and reallocate space from parking or general traffic on Kingsway and eight other bus corridors. Council has set a goal to improve travel times and reliability for transit users by at least 10% by 2026.

What's happening on Kingsway and Main St?

This project would change the curb lane and parking regulations on all of **Kingsway** (Main St to Boundary Rd) and part of **Main St** between Union St and E 7th Ave (see map A on pg. 4).

Starting in early 2026, the changes across the corridor include:

• **Bus Lanes & Parking/Loading** – The curb lane will be designated as a bus lane during certain times of day. Parking will be restricted during these hours.

Intersection Upgrades

- o Longer distances of no-stopping zones approaching busy intersections
- New right-turn signals and 'right turn only' signs at major intersections

• Bus Stop Changes on Route 19

 TransLink is proposing changes to 17 bus stop locations along Route 19 while adding 5 new stops near crosswalks to maintain accessibility.

What's Changing Around Your Business or Residence

We are planning to make the following changes on Kingsway between Dumfries St to Nanaimo St (see map B on pg. 4):

• Curb lane reserved for buses:

- o 7-10 am and 3-7 pm Mon-Fri in both directions
- Other vehicles may use the bus lane to make a right turn, but may not travel continuously through intersections

• Parking restrictions extended:

- o From 7-9:30 am Mon-Fri to 7-10 am and 3-7 pm Mon-Fri on the north side
- o From 3-6 pm Mon-Fri to 7-10 am and 3-7 pm Mon-Fri on the south side
- Longer no stopping zones approaching the intersections of Victoria Dr, Gladstone St (north side) and Nanaimo St

Bus stop changes affecting routes 19 and 25:

 Eastbound bus stops on Kingsway removed at Dumfries St and Perry St and replaced with a new stop at E King Edward Ave

Have your say - tell us about your business loading and parking needs

We understand that changes to curb space may affect pick-ups and deliveries, customer access, and parking. The proposed changes aim to reduce parking and loading impacts while targeting times when buses are delayed. We also want to hear from local businesses about impacts and possible solutions.


