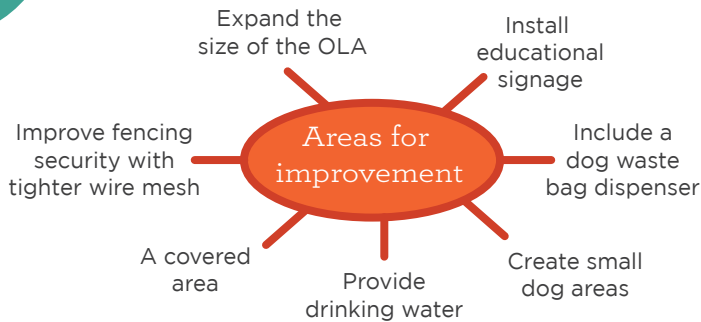

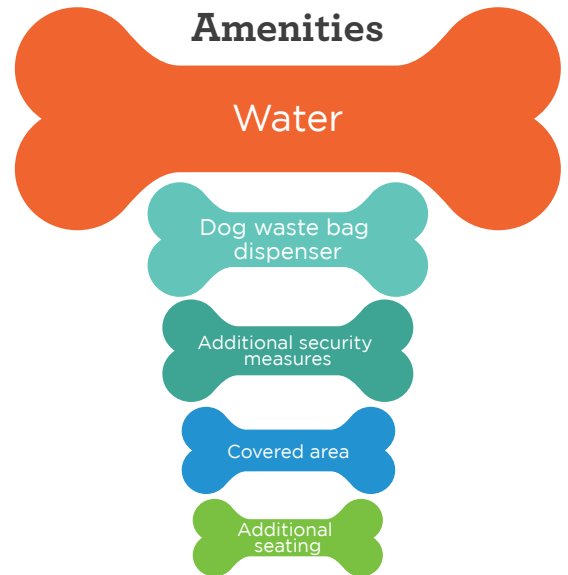

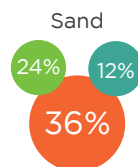

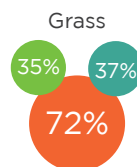

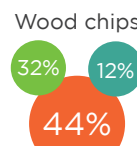

• May cause splinters



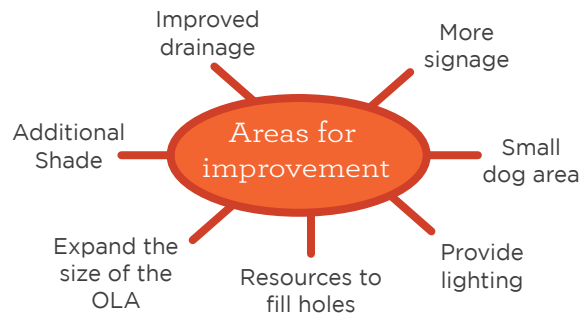

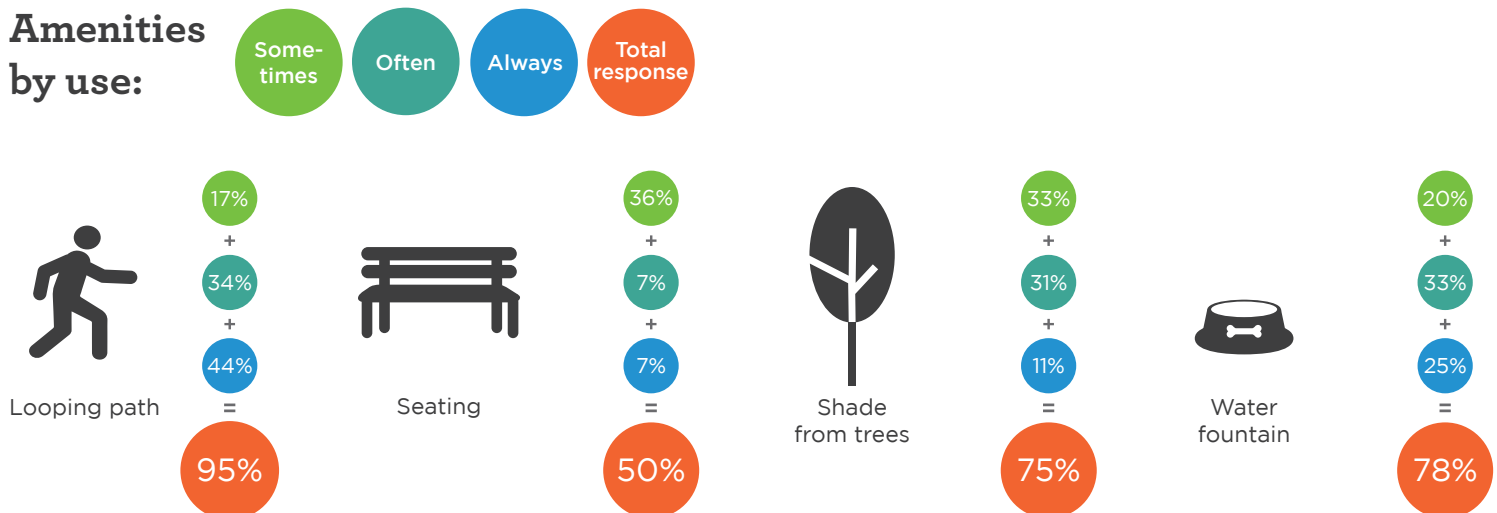
