RE: Ontario Street Upgrades




Figure 1 - Planned Ontario Street Upgrades (showing greenway connections).

The City of Vancouver plans to upgrade the Ontario Greenway along Ontario Street between Walter Hardwick Avenue and Second Avenue (see Figure 1). The Ontario Street upgrades will provide safer and more comfortable travel options for people of all ages and abilities while maintaining access for nearby businesses and residents. Construction is anticipated to begin in **fall 2025**.

These upgrades will also improve the connection between three of Vancouver's most popular walking and cycling routes: <u>Ontario Greenway</u>, <u>Central Valley Greenway</u>, and the <u>Seaside</u> <u>Greenway</u>.

Ontario Street Upgrades

Key changes along Ontario Street between Walter Hardwick and Second Avenue (see Figure 2) include:

- A two-way protected bike lane on the east side of Ontario Street
- A new protected intersection at Ontario Street and First Avenue
- Ontario Street becoming a one-way southbound street for vehicles
- On-street parking spaces maintained on the west side of Ontario Street

Connection with East Park Engagement

East Park is a new park in Olympic Village, located on the ancestral and unceded territories of the x^wməθk^wəỷəm (Musqueam), the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and the səlilwətal (Tsleil-Waututh) peoples.

We are working with Parks and Recreation staff who are seeking your feedback on two preliminary designs for the south side of East Park, between the Seaside Greenway and First Avenue. The designs are shaped by input from the local Nations and the community during the first round of engagement, held in fall 2022.

Through the design of East Park, we are also **exploring closing Ontario Street to vehicles between Walter Hardwick Avenue and Athletes Way** to increase future park space (see Figure 1).

The proposed one-block road closure would be installed in coordination with East Park. It could:

- Transform this block into more green space, contributing to urban biodiversity and space for bioretention (nature-based stormwater management).
- Provide traffic calming by reducing vehicle volumes.
- Require the removal of six metered parking spaces along the west side of Ontario Street between Walter Hardwick Avenue and Athletes Way.

A one-block vehicle closure is being explored between Walter Hardwick Avenue and Athletes Way to increase park space.
