The purpose of this document was to assist developers and architects involved in major redevelopment projects in Chinatown to better understand Chinatown historic character and to respond to it in their proposals. The document emphasized the need for developers and architects to respond adequately, not only to the technical aspects of the Chinatown design guidelines but also to its overarching principle of balancing the growth with preserving the heritage and cultural character of Chinatown.
