1) Celebrate Vancouver 125 / Mural Program **5.35PM-6.05PM**
525 Carrall St. (C, M) - Mural Proposal

Celebrate Vancouver 125 is a year long celebration of Vancouver's 125th anniversary. The program includes a mural initiative that will see ten murals installed across Vancouver by the end of this year.

The *Whispers Project* was chosen by an independent assessment committee to be one of the ten mural projects commissioned through the 125th Anniversary initiative. Staff from Celebrate Vancouver and Cultural Services will present background information on the Celebrate Vancouver 125 Program, the 125th Mural Program, and Whispers lead artist Eli Horn, will provide insight into the goals and plans for the Whispers mural project as it pertains to this committee.

Staff will present the mural proposal for 525 Carrall Street. The mural is developed for its south wall, facing Su Zhou Alley. The proposal would not affect heritage values of the site nor any of the character defining elements. The principal façades would not be affected either. 525 Carrall site is listed under the category "C" of the Vancouver Heritage Register and it is a municipally designated site.
