# What is this probe and why are we asking you to participate?

We understand that municipal governments have a role to play in supporting businesses & organizations in reducing food waste. This includes developing policy and guidelines, but can go beyond this. We hope that the results from this probe can help us in developing supports that reflect the needs and desires of food businesses and organizations.

This probe builds off of the previous research and workshops the CFIL team has developed, as well as insights shared by businesses and organizations. After asking about what values need to be embedded in food-related policy work and our broader food system, we want to take a closer look at what specifically would need to change for your operations or work in order to achieve some of the desired goals that were named in our previous co-design sessions.

## Purpose of the Probe

This probe is an invitation to imagine what steps your business or organization might take to reach a specific goal related to reducing food waste. This is facilitated through a series of self-led reflective questions.

Responses from this probe are intended to help us identify:

- What existing resources can businesses and organizations currently leverage to achieve these goals?
- What supports or incentives would be especially helpful, relevant, and desirable for municipal governments such as the City of Vancouver to consider offering to support businesses and organizations in achieving these goals?

# Rules for Play

This probe is meant to be flexible and fit your business and schedule needs. We recommend giving yourself at least 25 minutes to complete this probe. You can engage with it in one sitting or over a few days, alone or with colleagues.

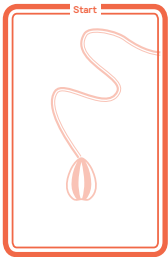
You will need:

- Card deck (1 start card, 1-17 question cards, 3 goal cards, 1 reflection card)
- Pen or pencil to write with
- Table to play on

## Before you start

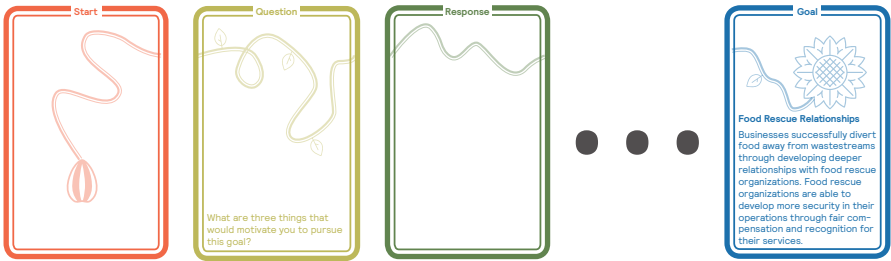
Take a moment to consider your business or organization as it currently exists. Think about all the people who are a part of it and who engage with it; the buildings and lands that it exists within. If you are able, take a quick walk around and observe what is going on right now. Reflect on your current strengths when it comes to food waste reduction and where you might need help.

## Set up



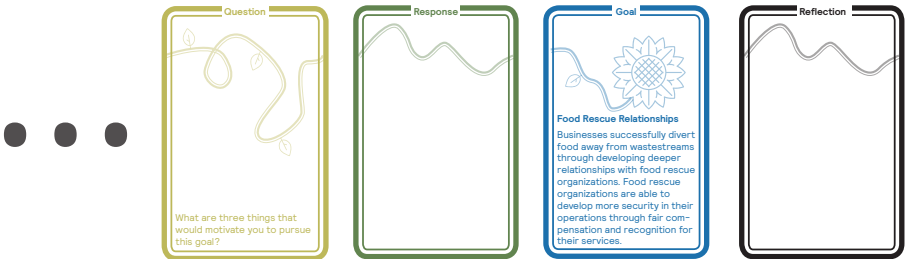
Place your START card on one side of your play area. Next, choose one (1) of the three (3) GOAL cards which you are most interested in exploring and place it on the other side. All remaining cards will be played in between these first cards and eventually connect them together.

# Play



Look through the QUESTION deck and pick a card that interests you. Place it next to your START card. Use a RESPONSE card to write or draw your responses to the selected question. Repeat with as many questions as you would like. Feel free to write in your own questions to respond to if you'd like!

# Finish

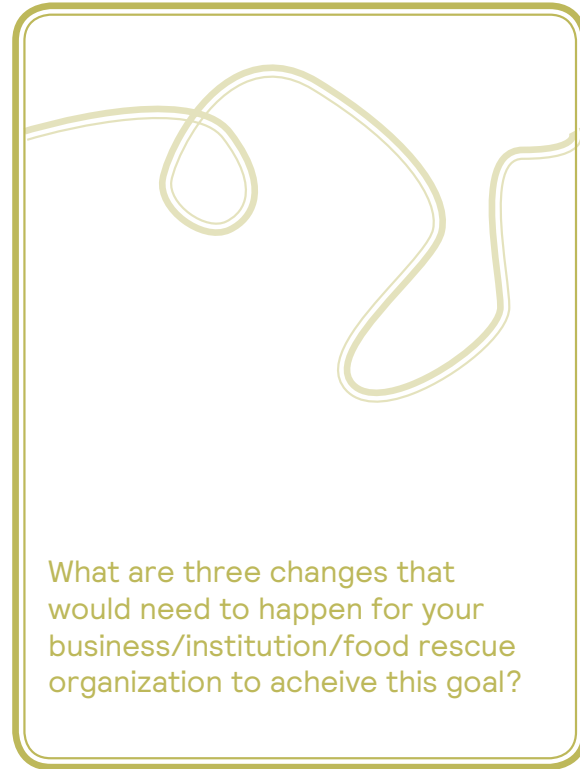


Connect the final RESPONSE card you played to your chosen GOAL card. Place down the REFLECTION card after your GOAL card and complete its instructions to end the game.

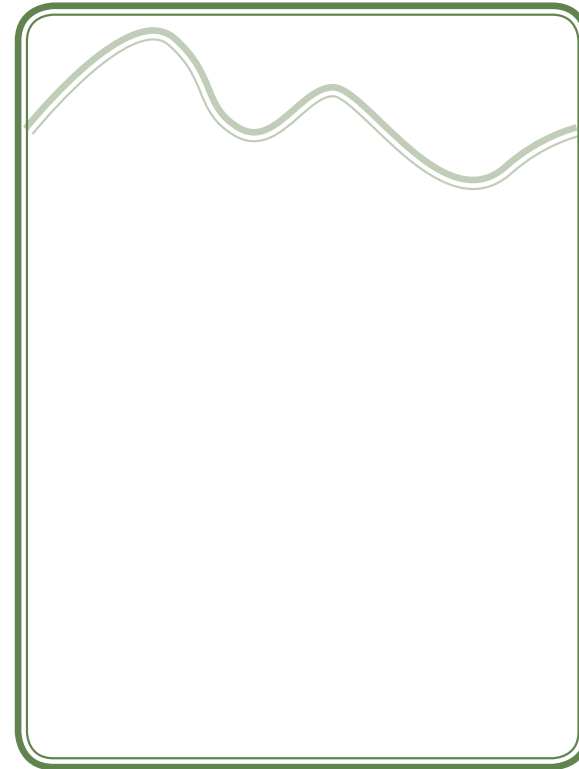

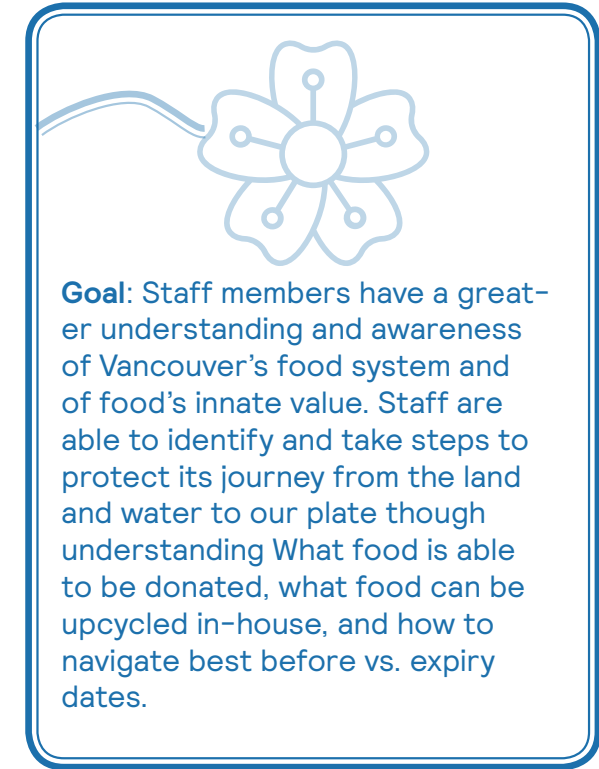

Question card

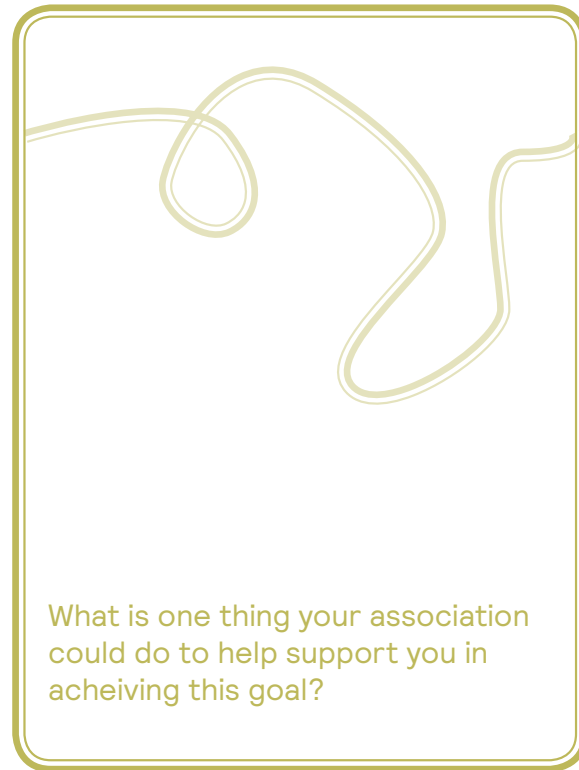


Response card—able to be written/drawn/collaged on

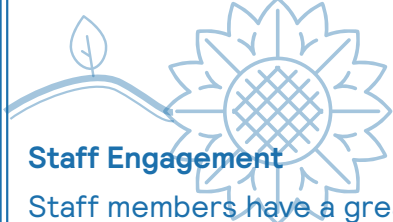


Goal card—the outcomes of what we hope our policy/guidelines will achieve
