## Quick Guide for Beginning Your JEDI Learning Journey

## Step 1. Choose your Learning Pathway

Read the descriptions of each Learning Pathway and choose one (or more) path for your learning this year.

- 1. **Reconciliation and Decolonization:** This Pathway helps staff understand the impacts of colonization, introduces staff to local Indigenous protocols, and ways of being, and provides a basic foundation for working with the local Nations and urban Indigenous communities.
- 2. **Inclusive Workplace:** This Pathway introduces the role we each have in creating a workplace where everybody feels included, cared for, and safe to be their full selves. This goes beyond the standard required courses on preventing workplace harassment.
- 3. **Anti-Oppression, Identity and Allyship:** This Pathway explores what it means to be anti-oppressive by unpacking the unique challenges faced by different marginalized groups, and the ways that others can support them as allies.

## **Step 2. Choose your Learning Level**

Read the statements under each Learning Level and see which ones apply to you most. You may be at different levels for each Learning Pathway.

Foundational: Provides core concepts and a broad introduction to a topic.	Applied: Provides concrete understanding of JEDI issues and skills for addressing them.	Extended: Deepens JEDI approach and builds capacity for critical self-reflection.
