RE: South False Creek Seawall Improvements – Stamps Landing Walking & Cycling Paths

In October 2015 and January 2016, the City of Vancouver talked with neighbourhood residents and businesses about how to improve the South False Creek Seawall between Burrard Bridge and Cambie Bridge. While most of the seawall construction was completed in the summer of 2018, Stamps Landing remains the last piece to be finalized.

Through the October 2015 open house and online feedback survey, residents supported a clear walking path and new cycling path on the west side of the Stamps Landing cul-de-sac to increase safety and reduce conflicts between people driving, cycling, and walking. To reflect that feedback, the City developed a preliminary design for Stamps Landing and reached out to adjacent businesses to refine the design.

We now have a recommended detailed design to share with the broader neighbourhood, and invite you to meet with us to ask questions and share your thoughts on the design.

Neighbourhood Chats

We will be hosting neighbourhood conversations in November, and invite you to meet with us to ask questions and share your thoughts on the design of Stamps Landing. We plan to have some small group chats at Convivial Café and Bakery, 680 Leg in Boot Square, on the following dates:

Stamps Landing: Design Overview

The new design of Stamps Landing aims to improve comfort and safety for people using the area by separating walking and cycling paths from vehicular traffic in the cul-de-sac. The changes would include**:

- a) An improved walking path to make the Seawall safer and more comfortable
- b) A new paved cycling path, separated from the walking path and vehicle traffic
- c) Additional bicycle parking
- d) Relocation of the current Mobi bike share station from the south side of the cul-de-sac to the area north of the cul-de-sac
- e) Replacement of the current Mobi bike share station with a 30-minute loading zone
- f) Replacement of the current civic marina loading spaces on the west side of the cul-de-sac with a 5-minute loading zone ('No Parking' zones allow stopping for 5 minutes to load or unload passengers or materials, and for 30 minutes for people with disabilities who have a valid parking permit)
- g) Relocation of the civic marina loading spaces from the west side of the cul-de-sac, to the east side of Moberly Road, behind the accessible parking space (which is currently 2 h parking)
- h) A widened sidewalk to facilitate marina loading
- i) Conversion of current 2 h parking on Moberly Road to metered parking, from Stamps Landing to Bucketwheel
- j) Reduced parking in the Mahony and Sons parking lot
- k) A new sidewalk around cul-de-sac
