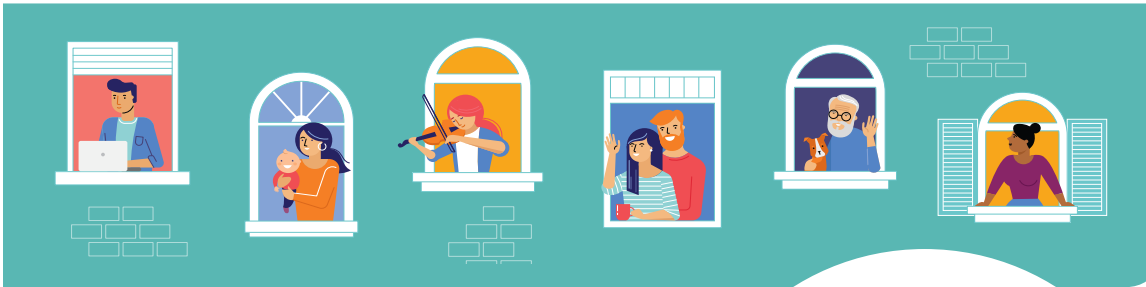


SURVEY SUMMARY 2020

CREATING AND RENEWING NON-PROFIT SOCIAL AND CO-OP HOUSING

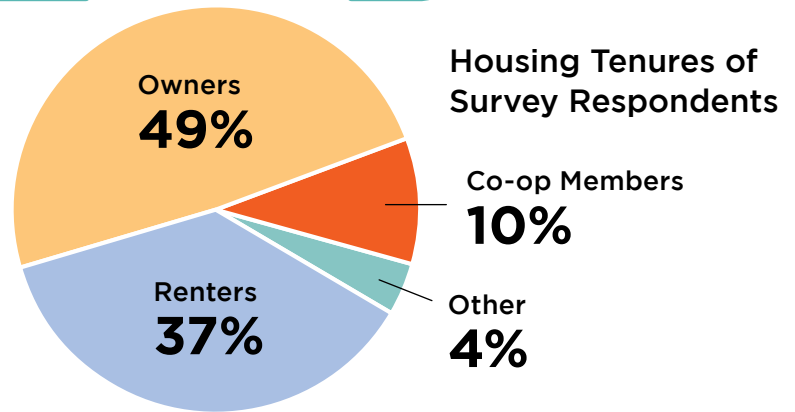


This Survey was open from September 10-27 and received **2,200+ RESPONSES**

WHAT WE'RE PROPOSING

In September 2020, the City launched an online survey on proposed zoning amendments to encourage development of non-profit social and co-op housing in select apartment areas across the city. These zoning changes would allow non-profit housing up to six storeys to be built through a streamlined process.

WHAT WE HEARD FROM RESPONDENTS



88% strongly or somewhat agreed that there is a need to **BUILD MORE HOUSING OWNED BY NON-PROFIT SOCIETIES AND CO-OPS**

83% strongly or somewhat agreed that it is appropriate to **REBUILD EXISTING NON-PROFIT HOUSING THAT IS AGING AND FACING HIGH REPAIR COSTS**

81% strongly or somewhat agreed that the City should encourage non-profit housing through **QUICKER APPLICATION PROCESSING, REDUCED FEES, AND GREATER BUILDING HEIGHT/DENSITY ALLOWANCES**

77% strongly or somewhat agreed with the proposed zoning amendments to **ENCOURAGE NON-PROFIT SOCIAL AND CO-OP HOUSING IN SELECT APARTMENT AREAS ACROSS THE CITY**

OTHER KEY THEMES

Housing Challenges for Low and Moderate Income Households

- High housing costs
- Lack of new affordable housing being built
- Zoning by-laws that restrict apartment housing
- Affordable housing concentrated in just a few areas of the city

Reasons for Support of the Proposals

- Need for more affordable housing
- To speed up the development process
- Improve neighbourhood diversity
- Proposed building scale is appropriate for these areas

Concerns With the Proposals

- Issues around neighbourhood fit
- Preference for smaller buildings
- Increased pressures on local amenities
