WHY VOTE?

Why should you vote?

On Saturday, April 5, Vancouver voters will elect two City Councillors who will make decisions that impact your:

- Emergency services (fire and police);
- Libraries and cultural programs;
- Water, sewer, and garbage collection services;
- Housing, sidewalks, social services, small businesses, parklets;
- and more!

Your vote shapes your community.



AM I ELIGIBLE TO VOTE?

To vote, you must:

- Be 18 years or older on April 5;
- Be a Canadian citizen;
- Have lived in B.C. for at least six months before registering;
- Live in Vancouver, no minimum days required, or own property in Vancouver; and,
- Not be disqualified by law from voting.

Property owners who don't live in Vancouver but have owned property for more than 30 days may still be eligible to vote as Non-Resident Property Electors. Scan the QR code, or visit vancouver.ca/NRPE to learn more.

Special notes

- Permanent residents cannot vote
- UBC/University Endowment Lands residents are not eligible to vote in this by-election

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

If you voted in the provincial election

You are already on Vancouver's voters list if you voted in the October 2024 B.C. provincial election. No need to register again.

Register when you vote

You can register or update your information:

- At your voting place on election day
- When voting by mail

ID requirements to register at voting locations

Bring two pieces of ID:

- Both must show your name
- One must include your address
- One must include your signature

Only have one piece of ID? You can make a solemn declaration to confirm your identity and residence.

If you have no fixed address

Register by providing a general location (e.g., intersection names) or the address of a shelter/social agency you use in Vancouver.

**If you're registered to vote, you're all set!
Just head to any voting location to cast your ballot.**

HOW CAN I VOTE?

You have three convenient options.

1. Vote in advance

Dates: March 26 & April 1 (8 am to 8 pm)

Location: Vancouver City Hall

2. Vote on Election Day

Date: April 5 (8 am to 8 pm)

Locations: Vancouver City Hall or any of the 24 community centres

Note: You can vote at any open location in Vancouver—no assigned locations

3. Vote-by-mail (free return postage)

Who can use it? Anyone—if you can't or don't wish to vote in person

Apply: March 3–24 for a package to be mailed to you at vancouver.ca/vote, by calling 3-1-1, or visiting the Election Office (305 West 8th Ave)

Ballot delivery: Mailed out (or available for pick-up) starting March 18

Return Deadline: Must arrive by April 5 (community centre drop boxes close at 5 pm; City Hall/Election Office closes at 8 pm)

Detailed information about vote by mail, including drop box locations, is in your vote-by-mail package.

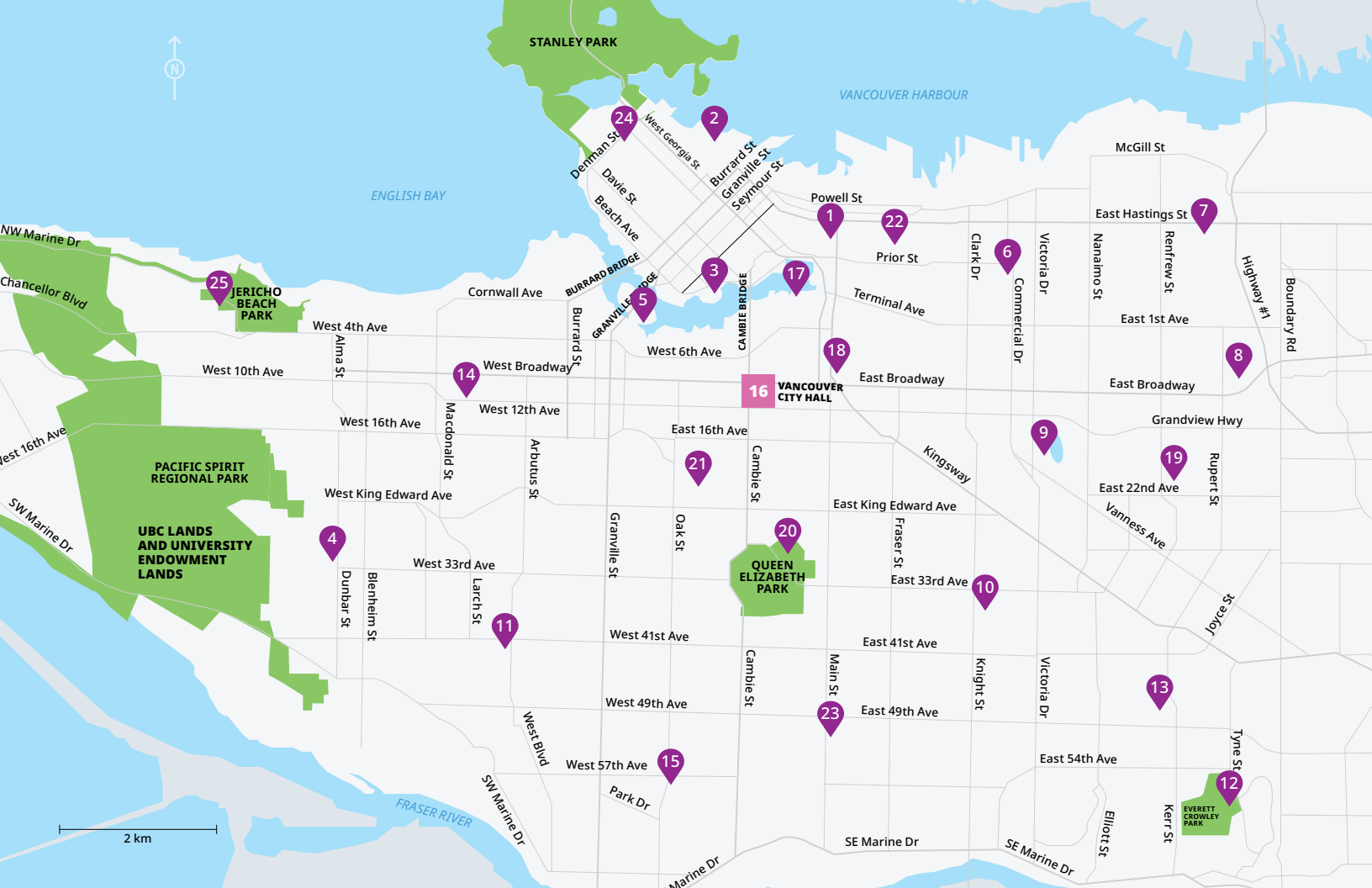
