





Wet Weather Inspection Form

Wet weather inspection's are a community science tool used to help city staff evaluate how well rain gardens across the city are performing. These are quick 5-10 minute visual surveys that help us understand how well rain gardens are collecting, conveying and absorbing rainwater. Rainspections are completed while it's raining, and look at:

- How much water is entering into the rain garden
- How much water is ponding in the rain garden



Before getting started, remember these quick safety tips:

- Ensure you can find a safe space for your inspection. Don't stand on a road or bike lane.
- Avoid entering the rain garden

Is the rain garden overflowing?

Visually inspect the grate in the garden, including the curbs and outlet (it may look like a catch
basin lid or a plastic beehive) to see if water is going into them or over them. Overflow means
that the rain garden is fully saturated with water.

Estimate the percent of the rain garden that is covered by rainwater

Visually inspect the garden and estimate how much of it is ponded with rainwater. No need to measure, your best guess is fine. Ponding in a rain garden is normal; it's been designed to hold and slowly infiltrate rainwater.
