Re: Changes to parking on 10th Ave. between Windsor St. and Glen Dr.

In response to safety concerns along the 10th Avenue Corridor and to improve visibility for people walking, cycling and driving, the City of Vancouver plans to change the parking regulations on 10th Ave., between Windsor St. and Glen Dr. The regulations on the south side of the street would change from *unregulated parking* and '*No Parking Except Residents of this Block*' to '*No Parking*.'*

In addition to the east-west cycling traffic along 10th Ave., this section of 10th Ave. serves as a busy cycling connection between the north-south bike routes on Windsor St. (south of 10th Ave) and Glen Dr. (north of 10th Ave). The existing layout in this stretch, which allows parking on both sides of the street, poses the following safety issues:

- 10th Ave., between Windsor St. and Glen Dr. has a high number of reported bicycle collisions (compared to other blocks of 10th Ave, east of Cambie St.), many of which involve parked cars.
- The space with parking on both sides is not wide enough for people cycling to safely pass an oncoming car, and therefore does not meet the City's design guidelines for all ages and abilities (AAA) cycling routes. - Parked vehicles on both sides of the street limit visibility between people cycling, walking and driving, especially near the intersections at Windsor St. and Glen Dr.

Removing the parking on the south side of the street will improve conditions for passing, increase visibility, and lower the chance of collisions, improving the safety of all road users on 10th Ave. Following implementation, the occupancy of the on-street parking in the affected area will be monitored.

This change is expected to be implemented in early 2020.

*Note: The Street and Traffic Bylaw states that vehicles may stop in a 'No Parking' zone for up to five minutes to load or unload passengers or materials. Motorists with a valid parking permit for people with disabilities (a SPARC placard) can use No Parking zones for up to 30 minutes for loading and unloading passengers or materials.
