Proposal, concept and market sounding



The City of Vancouver considers turning former recycling materials receiving yard into a "Zero Waste Demonstration Hub"

Worldwide, municipal leaders are setting aggressive targets to reduce waste to landfill and advance circular economy initiatives for the benefit of the environment, economy, and community. A variety of actions will be required outside of conservation, material reuse and repair as we transition to a circular economy.

Recognizing that innovation will play a key role in this transition, the **City of Vancouver** is exploring, with the **Vancouver Economic Commission**, an opportunity to transition an existing industrial-sized demonstration site (its former recycling materials receiving yard) into a space for innovators to pilot zero waste solutions. Through this exploratory phase, we aim to better understand the resources and connections that innovators would need from the potential zero waste solutions hub.

1198 East Kent Avenue South Vancouver South Industrial Area (M-2 heavy industrial zone)

Site details:

- » Paved, secured, fenced and lit outdoor site
- » 1.1 acres total land

- » innovative zero waste tech providers
- » co-locating for 18 to 24 months
- » post-lab, pre-commercial
