Some collections feature plants that are closely related, while others include plants from specific regions or habitats. Here we highlight just a few of the plants that are of interest today. Enjoy!

**1 Winter Walk:** Bright red berries of holly and mountain ash, flame coloured dogwood stems and icy stalks of whitewash bramble light up this winter garden.



**2 Giant redwoods:** Just 50 years old, these trees are already small giants. The world's largest tree by volume, *Sequoiadendron giganteum* can live for 3,500 years and grow to over 80 meters tall!



**3 BC Habitat Garden:** A forest of native trees, ferns, flowering perennials and shrubs that support wildlife with food, shelter and nesting habitat, while showcasing the beauty of our native plants.



4 Cutleaf staghorn sumac: Are those reindeer hiding in the garden? In winter, the bare curved velvety branches of this shrub look just like the horns of a young male deer!



**5 Beautyberry:** Along this shady forest path, clusters of jewel-toned purple berries light up the bare branches of these tall graceful shrubs.



**6 Meditation Garden:** This quiet, minimalist garden of stone, moss and trees is the perfect place for a contemplative rest.



**7 Fern Dell:** A shady, peaceful grove of Douglas-fir trees, along with trees and shrubs from East Asia and an understory of feathery ferns from around the world.



**8 Maze:** Our hedge maze is made up of over 2,000 pyramidal cedars and is fun to explore! It is especially beautiful with a light dusting of frost or snow.



**9 Autumn camellia (Camellia sasanqua 'Setsugekka'):** An autumn blooming camellia. The scented flowers have ruffled white petals and bright yellow stamens.



10 Sorbus pseudohupehensis (formerly known as Sorbus hupehensis 'Pink Pagoda'): Clusters of candy-coloured pink berries decorate this mountain ash.
