

**Executive summary excerpts of reports presented to *in camera* meetings of the Vancouver Police Board between January 1, 2011 and April 1, 2011**

**Report #1107: Strategies to respond to an increase in sex offences**

This report outlines the VPD's strategies to address the increase in sexual assaults observed since 2009. The report includes information regarding the characteristics of these sex offences from which the strategies to reduce sex offences were developed. This report is provided to the Police Board for information.

**Report #1109: Office of the Police Complaints Commissioner Complaints – Comparisons between Vancouver Police Department and other Municipal Forces**

Chief Constable Chu requested that Planning, Research & Audit review the Office of the Police Complaint Commissioner's (OPCC) most recent report and compare Vancouver's level of complaints to other municipal departments (excluding RCMP detachments as the RCMP do not fall under the oversight of the OPCC). This report outlines how the Vancouver Police Department (VPD) compares against other agencies with respect to decisions concluded as substantiated and what percentage or ratio of complaints are brought to agencies' attention by population estimates and calls for service (CFS) from April 1 to September 30, 2009 and 2010.

**Report #1111: Human Resources – Superintendent Promotion**

The rank of Superintendent, Deputy Chief, and Chief are contractual positions between the Police Board and the employee. The Inspectors leave the VPOA bargaining unit when they sign the Superintendent contract.

This report will recommend the promotion of Inspector Mike Porteous to the rank of Superintendent subject to his agreement on the Superintendent rank contract terms.

**Report #1121: Estimate of staffing for the 2011 Stanley Cup playoffs**

The cost for this extraordinary policing need is not included in the 2011 police budget. This report is submitted for the information of the Police Board. The VPD recommends giving Council advanced warning of significant expenditures, such as the Stanley Cup Playoffs, that will affect the VPD's ability to complete the year within budget.

**Report #1124: Missing Women Commission of Inquiry - Legal Representation**

The purpose of this report is to inform and update the Vancouver Police Board (VPB) with regards to the legal representation for the *Missing Women Commission of Inquiry*. At the February 16<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Board requested that a more comprehensive plan be presented along with strategies to identify a budget and minimize costs.
