Re: Records Access Request

We are replying to your request for information that was received in our office on February 7, 2018. In that request, you sought access to the following:

1. Over a time period of January 2017 to February 2018 all Vancouver Police calls for service listed by priority and police attendance to the following locations:
 - 138 E Hastings St (Sequel)
 - 159 E Hastings St (Balmoral Hotel)
 - 160 E Hastings St (Regent Hotel)
2. Any incident reports from January 2018 and date of request that refer to a pellet gun or bb gun being shot in the area of 138 E Hastings St (Sequel).

Please note that the data for item 1 has been provided in Pivot Table format. You will find all calls for service to the above addresses made to the VPD from January 1, 2017 to February 22, 2018. Each Incident Type is divided by priority number, with either a Y if police attended or an N if police did not attend. These calls may be related to events inside or external to the premise (e.g. theft of vehicle outside, theft within vehicle, fight outside premise).

For item 2, we searched our records from January 1, 2018 to February 22, 2018 and were able to locate one incident report based on the information you provided. Enclosed please find a copy of the CAD (computer-aided dispatch) printout for this incident.

Information that could unreasonably invade the privacy of other persons has been removed from the CAD. Particular emphasis in this case has been placed on sections 16(1)(b) and 22(3)(b) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* ("the Act"). Excerpts of these provisions are attached. Information may also have been removed on the basis of additional sections.

Under s. 52 of the Act, you may ask the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review our response to your request. You have thirty (30) days from the receipt of this letter to request a review by writing to:

Disclosure harmful to intergovernmental relations or negotiations

- 16 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose information to an applicant if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to...(b) reveal information received in confidence from a government, council or organization listed in paragraph (a) or their agencies

Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (3) A disclosure of personal information is presumed to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy...(b) the personal information was compiled and is identifiable as part of an investigation into a possible violation of law, except to the extent that disclosure is necessary to prosecute the violation or to continue the investigation
